Gifting with Grace!

2022 is a Grace family Christmas, we celebrate the joy of the season by giving our kids Christmas gifts, to celebrate... them! This pouring out of love upon our Grace children will be a defining piece of our autumn stewardship emphasis: *Giving with Grace!*

We invite everyone to participate as you are able. As a congregation, we will have gift tags on our <u>Giving with Grace!</u> tree that people of Grace are invited to take with them, to gift a child (buy them a gift) of Grace who is 8th grade and younger. Those items will be a **book**, **clothing**, **or** a **play** thing. Each item should be valued in the \$15-20 range. Our <u>Giving with Grace!</u> tree will be ready soon, and all gifts need to be returned to Grace <u>NO LATER THAN DECEMBER 11</u>, so that if extra shopping is needed, we are covered.

There will be a sign up sheet at church for you to sign so that we know who is buying what item for each child. Each item should be wrapped separately, so each child will get to open three gifts. You can select one item, or as many as you wish. When bringing the wrapped gift, however, please indicate that it is from *Grace*, rather than yourself. After Dec 11, Grace will contact any givers that have not had the opportunity to bring their gifts, and find out if said giver can do so before Dec 18, or if the church should take that role.

On December 18 (*Giving with Grace!* Appeal Sunday) we will all celebrate *Giving with Grace!* as children of God at our 9:15 a.m. worship! Following worship, we will potluck brunch together, and we will enjoy watching our children unwrap their gifts from Grace!! What a wonderful way for our children to know they are loved, and a wonderful way for us to celebrate Christmas with them...a Grace family Christmas!

And guess what... the kids will also have a hand in *Giving with Grace!* We are partnering with a social service agency that takes care of kids in our community to provide Christmas gifts for children who can also benefit from knowing that they are loved.

We ask **Grace families with children** to choose a tag for these special children, and for Grace parents to help Grace children select and purchase gifts for these special children. Grace children will need to bring these gifts to worship December 18, when they will present them as their offering.

This is a lean church that depends on each of us participating. The potential for doing ministry is always huge. Potential becomes reality when people step forward and participate. Thanks for *your* generous participation.

As we transition from summer to fall, from steeple construction to open streets and sanctuaries, I see kids wonderfully loved and lead by our teachers, I see the hungry being fed, staff serving people in the community and in crisis, adults and tweens encountering Jesus anew, and a burning desire to grow and flourish.

Notes from Cantor JB George...

In the church year, November is framed by All Saints Day, Christ the King, and the beginning of

Advent. These fit well with the gathering of the final harvest in the northern hemisphere and our secular holiday of Thanksgiving. As we remember our beloved departed on All Saints Day, this year will include my dad, who died on All Saints Sunday last year (at the exact moment, as far as we can determine, when we sang "Lord, Now Let Your Servant Depart in Peace"). We take comfort that those we miss are still with us in Christ, a communion especially made real to us in Holy Communion. Here is a new text in *All Creation Sings* that touches on so many of those themes: (as with all poetry, it's better if you read it aloud...)

- Look who gathers at Christ's table!
 Hear the stories that they bring.
 Some are weeping; some are laughing;
 some have songs they want to sing.
 Others ask why they're invited, burdened by the wrong they've done.
 Christ insists they all are welcome.
 There is room for ev'ryone.
- Clouds of light surround the table; ancient followers appear, saints confessing how they wrestled with their guilt, their doubt and fear. Peter tells of his denying Christ was ever in his sight; Paul relates his fruitless efforts to obliterate the light.
- Their sad stories are repeated in a thousand diff'rent ways, but they share one thing in common: they all end in thanks and praise for the host who has invited north and south and east and west to converge around this table, where all life is fed and blest.
- Bring your joy and bring your sadness, and prepare to be surprised by the host whose hands are wounded, who will open wide your eyes when he blesses bread and breaks it—truth and manna from above!—and then passes wine that wakens in your heart the taste of love.

FOOD PANTRY REPORT

As Christ fed the multitudes, the mission of the Grace Lutheran Church Food Pantry is to feed the hungry.

During the month of September the Food Pantry served 571 households and 1,401 individuals. This brought our year-to-date client totals through the end of September to 5,015 households and 12,234 individuals, an increase of 50 percent over last year at this time. However, taking a longer view, our monthly totals now are running fairly close to the client numbers we saw in the last full prepandemic year of 2019.

Thanks mainly to income of over \$17,000 that was raised at the second annual Pantry golf outing, we ended September with an account balance of \$69,476. Our expenses for the year have totaled \$115,000 vs. income of \$96,000, a deficit of about \$19,000. While the overall account balance remains healthy for now, the shortfall of \$2,000-\$3,000 per month makes it challenging for us to keep giving clients milk, bread and eggs, which we began doing at the onset of the pandemic and has proven to be very appreciated by clients. At its quarterly meeting in October, the Food Pantry Board approved a few operational changes intended to reduce the number of canned foods we purchase in the hope that we can cut those costs enough to keep providing milk, bread and eggs.

In November we'll receive a nice boost from the annual food collection drives at St. John's Lutheran Church and Our Savior's Lutheran School. Also in November, several Pantry volunteers will help Grace and Peace Lutheran churches provide Thanksgiving food baskets to McClernand, Franklin, Blackhawk and Jefferson schools. The churches reimburse the Food Pantry account for expenses associated with these food baskets.

We are always on the lookout for anyone interested in helping us unload and store deliveries on Monday mornings (from about 8:45 to 10:15) and/or to carry bags up a stairwell to clients during regular Pantry hours of 11 to 1 on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. This requires that volunteers be comfortable carrying boxes that can sometimes weigh 20 pounds and more. Schedules can be flexible, so it's ok if you can only come once or twice a month instead of weekly. The Pantry will be closed Thanksgiving Day. For the Christmas/New Year holiday weeks, we will be closed the last week of December and will reopen on Thursday, Jan. 5.

Holiday Food Baskets have been a long tradition of Grace Lutheran Church. We partner with other Lutheran churches and schools in the area to provide food to help make the holidays a bit better for families in need. Baskets are provided before Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. It is time once again to look toward funding and implementing the holiday basket program. Though funded separately from Grace Food Pantry by Grace, Peace Lutheran and St Johns Lutheran, we use obtain the food through the pantry and reimburse it for the costs. We have already begun stocking up for the baskets for Thanksgiving. Those baskets will go out November 16 and November 18.

Please consider donating to the Holiday Baskets, which cost about \$50 per basket. Grace pays for 60 baskets per holiday. That is \$3,000 for each of Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. Your help is appreciated. Each family receives a tote with about \$50 worth of groceries and personal items, including a ham, milk, bread, eggs, potatoes, apples, numerous non-perishable cans and boxes of food, and a bag of toiletries. You can support this ministry by donating cash (earmarked for Holiday Food Baskets) and/or the nonperishable foods listed below:

Non-perishable Needs for Holiday Food Baskets:

- * Cans of green beans, corn, peaches, pears, pork and beans, ravioli, and pasta sauce
- * Boxes of spaghetti, macaroni and cheese, saltine crackers, and cereal
- * Jars of peanut butter, jars of jelly (plastic, not glass, please)



Stewardship Stories: Our Original Church Lady

Stewardship stories are our monthly human-interest pieces on how God through Grace Lutheran Church has impacted and changed people's lives. For this month we spotlight our original church lady, Charlotte Blumle.

Charlotte is to me the living representation of the saving you'll find on Grace's stained-glass window, "Welcome the Stranger." Charlotte was one of the first to greet us when we came to Grace and make us feel like we were home. So, I found it hard to believe when she told me that as a kid she was shy all the way through high school. Moving from the country to Springfield at age 5, Charlotte's mother brought her and the rest of the family to Grace Lutheran Church. Charlotte said back then when you got baptized at



Grace you'd have to get in line with 20 to 25 other kids because the church did baptisms only once a year back then. Despite being shy Charlotte built a strong faith in Jesus thanks to wonderful Sunday School teachers like Helen Schweitzer, Rev. Dr. A. Burd Argenbright, and Mary Tews. It was these inspirational teachers and an offer at age 17 by Pinky Tews the superintendent of the Sunday School asking her to teach the 2nd grade Sunday School Class that got Charlotte over her shyness and become the friendly welcoming person we know today. Since then Charlotte has been heavily involved in the church including leading Faith-Grace Circle for the last 38 years.

The willingness and care that the people of Grace provide are one of the many things that have kept Charlotte coming to church for the last 83 years. "It is such a friendly and caring church, I remember when COVID started, and we were stuck at home and people would stop by and bring me food. People are always checking in to make sure I am doing okay and providing transportation if I need it. I also remember a time when I had to travel to California to care for my mother's sister in hospice for a few months. When I came back after she passed the Pastor made an announcement saying it was good to have me back and everyone applauded for my return."

One of the last things Charlotte mentioned to me about why she comes to Grace every Sunday is to hear the Pastor's sermons/homilies. "There have been five pastors here during my time at Grace and every time I think there won't be anyone better than the last, I am proven wrong." She loves listening to the wonderful music program put together by JB and loves spending time with her second family, her church family. That is why she is one of our favorite original church ladies.
